deeds to land I hereby appoint J. A. Eary and H. N. Harrah my Executors  
to do whatever is necessary to execute this will; also with power to sell  
and convey my mineral rights, but not for less than ten dollars per acre  
neither in making such sale shall any right to use the surface or any  
thing on the surface be conveyed I will that of my mineral right be  
sold, one thousand dollars of the proceeds shall be placed in bank to  
be divided between my two youngest children when they arrive at twenty  
one years of age the remainder to be divided as follows: my daughter  
Samantha one hundred and fifty dollars; my daughter Elizabeth one hun-  
dred dollars my son S. C. Eary one hundred dollars

This is a codicil to my will dated the 26 day of September 1892. Whereas in said will I gave my son George Thomas a certain piece or parcel of land, describing its boundaries. I will that so much of said piece of land as lies on the West side of the creek and bounded as follows, to wit; Beginning at a white oak and sourwood on bank of creek thence a straight line nearly West to an apple tree at a corner of lot around the house in which George Thomas Eary now lives, thence a straight line along the top of ridge to my out side line on the top of the mountain; thence with the top of the mountain to R. Eary's line, and with same to

the creek and with the creek to the beginning shall be for any one of  
Hunters in fee simple.

I will that my son Joseph Frankline shall have the use of a piece of land  
given to him in said Will, where he shall marry or shall be twenty one  
years of age: but it is my will that he shall not have power to dispose  
of the same until he shall be thirty years of age.

I will that my wife Matilda and my son George Thomas have the custody  
of the lands herein given to Wm. Hunter and Joseph Frankline during their  
minority, and attend to the payment of the taxes on the same, which they  
may do by renting or working said land.

I will that my daughter Rosa Frances one hundred dollars instead of three  
hundred.

I will to Nannah Evaline Paine fifty dollars instead of seventy five

I will to my daughter Sarahtha one hundred dollars instead of one hundred  
and fifty

I will to my daughter Elizabeth Anna fifty dollars instead of one hundred  
and fifty I will that if the money arising from the sale of my mineral  
rights, two hundred dollars shall be paid to each of my children who get  
his land by deed or by my will or this codicil.
